These delegates collaborated within targeted thematic working groups, meticulously examining facets including protection, consular assistance, administrative processes, civic participation, data analysis, and intergenerational interaction.

FEATURED STORY

Multistakeholder consultation on the creation of the future Global Diaspora Policy Alliance

On May 17th, IOM organized a pivotal multistakeholder consultation to openly discuss the establishment of the Global Diaspora Policy Alliance (GDPA), addressing working modalities, scope, content, and potential partnerships.

In 2022, IOM co-hosted the Global Diaspora Summit and unveiled The Dublin Declaration—a transformative plan empowering diasporas in sustainable development and humanitarianism. The declaration outlines a visionary framework for diaspora engagement across policies, programmes, and partnerships.

During the GDS, a commitment was made to create the Global Diaspora Policy Alliance (GDPA), fostering collaboration among governments, stakeholders, diaspora leaders, youth activists, and policymakers. The consultation served as a platform to kickstart discussions on the constitution of the Alliance.

The GDPA aims to complement existing facilities, prioritizing diaspora engagement in global development policy frameworks, and accelerating SDG implementation. The event marks a significant milestone, empowering diasporas as key contributors to shaping a more inclusive and sustainable world. REGIONAL FOCUS

The Dynamic Journey of South American Diaspora Engagement

Originating from significant European immigration, the emergence of the South American diaspora gained momentum after World War II, marked by impactful waves in the 1970s, 80s, and the 2000s. South Americans have dispersed globally, including settlements in Japan, Italy, Canada, with Spain and the United States being preferred destinations. Despite this, many have chosen neighboring countries, contributing to their homeland's stability and development. The South American Conference for Migration (SACM) has consistently emphasized diaspora engagement, seen during the 2001 and 2005 Conferences and a pivotal moment in the 2012 XII SACM Conference. Here, a preliminary report highlighted varied engagement programs addressing expatriates' needs such as protection, economic rights, heritage preservation, and expanded political rights.

The echoes of this discourse resonated through the XII, XIII, and XVI SACM conferences, resulting in commitments to joint projects that connect with the South American diaspora and exchange best practices. Amidst COVID challenges, this commitment bore fruit during the 2022 XX SACM, marked by the creation of the inaugural Roadmap for Empowering the South American Diaspora.

This roadmap stemmed from a virtual workshop involving 50 delegates from ten member states, organized into thematic working groups exploring areas such as protection, consular assistance, administrative procedures, civic participation, data analysis, and with engagement newer generations. Spirited brainstorming sessions yielded actionable steps forming the Roadmap. Notably, it was underpinned by a comprehensive regional analysis derived from 120 interviews, focus groups, and an online survey involving 1,173 diaspora members.

This analysis unveiled intriguing insights. Notably, 57% of female respondents saw living abroad as offering increased opportunities, with 45% citing enhanced freedom. Women, overall, emphasized the significance of obstacles more than men. Additionally, 51% emphasized scientific collaboration, 52% noted the importance of remittances, 45% highlighted economic investments, and 43% mentioned the impact of tourism.

The Roadmap's implementation began with a major step - a regional diaspora engagement training in November 2022. Representatives from Argentina, Chile, Colombia, Guyana, and beyond convened, facilitating shared learning and regional cooperation. As the journey advances from analysis to collaborative action, South American diaspora engagement thrives, transcending boundaries to unite nations. This journey acknowledges the diaspora's transformative potential, channeling not just remittances but skills, networks, and cultural bonds for positive change.
